## A Word from the Pastor

Here we are entering not only a new year but a new decade, in 2020. In these times our Christian holy Scriptures, the Bible, has things to tell us as we enter times like these.

Our faith gives us a hopeful outlook even when entering times of uncertainty and fearfulness, even when we are unsure of the future. Like our best president Abraham Lincoln said in a moment of great thoughtfulness, even when the pressure of a divided country weighed him down, he put his thoughts to paper writing: "The will of God prevails. In great contests each party claims to act in accordance with the will of God. Both may be, and one must be wrong. God cannot be for, and against the same thing at the same time.

In the present civil war it is quite possible that God's purpose is something different from the purpose of either party --- and yet the human instrumentalities, working just as they do, are of the best adaptation to effect His purpose." . . .

The prophet Isaiah says of God: "For my thoughts are not your thoughts, nor are your ways my ways, says the Lord. For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts."

It seems to me as we begin a new year and a new decade, that discernment is called for. The work of listening for God's voice and God's leading, must be paid attention to. For the Holy Spirit speaks, and teaches us ways we can serve God's purposes, and do God's work with the resources and people who are the church the "body of Christ," here where God has placed us.

As one example, If we are hearing God rightly in 2020, God may be calling us to a renewed relationship with Adult Day Care, through Prime Horizon, in the new year.

God also reminds us to trust him to bring about newness through the power of the Holy Spirit. God does not always reveal what this newness looks like. Just that we trust God to bring about what we need for new life. Like Isaiah again says: "I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating; for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight."

So we pray for and await God's renewing presence in our lives and in the world. And we listen for God to speak to us anew; to show us how to keep on being and acting as God's people, God's children, here where God has placed us! Like St. Paul tells us (1 Corinthians 2:16) "For who has known the mind of the Lord, so as to instruct him?" But we have the mind of Christ."...

And we go into the new year with faith, hope, and love, learning with "the mind of Christ." Trusting that God will lead us to where we need to go, by following the one who indeed is "The Way, the truth, and the life."

We do our listening and discerning under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Just like St. Paul says (Romans 12:2) "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God---what is good and acceptable and perfect."

May you have a truly blessed new year of 2020! Peace be to you! *Pastor Jim*

They will be present after the worship service for a question and answer session as well






