In re-reading a good book from a decade ago, Diana Butler Bass the faith historian's book *"Christianity For the Rest of Us,"* with the subtitle: "How the Neighborhood Church is Transforming the Faith," at this time of congregational meetings and preparations for the coming year, she writes that, churches don't change just for marketing purposes, to get new people in the doors with gimmicks.

The best of churches change at a much deeper level, and for different reasons. Each congregation she studied for her book asked two powerful questions that sparked deep change: "Who are we?" And "What is God calling us to do?"

Continuing, she writes great food for thought for ALL churches: (These congregations) "discovered a renewed sense of identity and a clear purpose in serving the world. They experienced a change of heart that transformed their communal understanding of WHO GOD HAD MADE THEM TO BE."

Let me say that, in the things we are trying to accomplish in this first year of the new decade of 2020, this is what we who are the "body of Christ," known as St. John Lutheran Church Grafton, hope to be and do!

Such things include, establishing a renewed adult day center serving senior citizens in the area, which will be named something like: *"Prime Adult Wellness Center."* Which will return us to our desire (as we understand God's will) to serving our community with the building God has graciously given us for one!

Related to this would be a new church sign, and a wheelchair lift, again, all in service to the folks in our area, and county, who are in need of what we can offer. These things are yet to be worked out in detail over the coming year. But they remind us at the same time, as was said by theologian Walter Wink, "we should not do more than God is calling us to do. And yet we must also not do less."

Let us call on God's Holy Spirit, to guide us into the future of the new decade, and the future of the "Body of Christ," here on the corner of Lakefield and Port Washington roads through 2020 and beyond.








9 "verses" that aren't in the Bible

Several popular sayings can put biblical literacy to the test. For example, the phrases below aren't in Scripture — although some come pretty close:

- "Money is the root of all evil." (According to 1 Timothy
- 6:10, "the love of money is a root of all kinds of evil.")
- "Cleanliness is next to godliness." (The closest teaching to this might be in James 4:8.)
- "God helps those who help themselves." (This proverb originated in ancient Greece, not in Scripture.)
- "God moves in mysterious ways." (A verse kind of like this is Isaiah 55:8.)
- "Spare the rod, spoil the child." (British poet Samuel Butler coined this phrase, which could be a paraphrase of Proverbs 13:24.)
- "This, too, shall pass." (This occurs nowhere in the Bible but has been linked, incorrectly, to King Solomon.)
- "Love the sinner, hate the sin." (St. Augustine originally came up with a version of this phrase.)
- "Charity begins at home." (British theologian John Wycliffe is credited with this saying.)
- "God will never give you more than you can bear." (This seems to be a misinterpretation of 1 Corinthians 10:13.)
