Already we find ourselves at the end of another year! Many people have gone through a lot. And yet, while the weather definitely turns colder, and there is less light in the sky with shorter daytimes, we are still reminded of hope!

The church year seasonal color for Advent (meaning arrival or coming) is blue. Not for despair as in having the blues, but blue for the color of HOPE. And hope has to do with our ability, as we trust in the Trinitarian God, has to do with, imagining a new future. Can we?

At the end of December, the amount of light visible in the sky begins to increase, just a bit, after the darkness of late fall, and after the winter solstice of December 21-22. It's easy to have a pity party and lament the things we have not had over these two years. I hold tight to my family, my faith, my health...and look forward to the dawning of 2022 with hopes that we will continue to go forward with steadfast faith.

- Spices or salt and pepper would be a real Christmas gift
- Oil is a luxury, but needed to make Rice-a-Roni which they also get lots of
- Tea bags and coffee make them feel like you
- Sugar and flour are treats
- They rarely get fresh meat (The Food Pantry in Port will take fresh meat and produce)



- Hamburger Helper goes nowhere without ground beef
- They get lots of peanut butter and jelly, but usually not sandwich bread
- Tuna and crackers make a good lunch
- Butter or margarine are always nice
- Eggs are a real commodity
- Dishwashing detergent is expensive and always appreciated
- Feminine hygiene products are a luxury and women will cry over them
- Everyone loves Stove Top Stuffing
- Seeds are cool in spring and summer growing can be easy for some


