# A Word from the Pastor

We now enter the 2<sup>nd</sup> month of the new year of 2022. In this time of deep winter, and the season of Epiphany, meaning "Manifestation," or "Revelation," the church year calendar starts us off with the vision of the wise men, who follow the star of Bethlehem, to the place where Jesus can be found. It's only appropriate to look for signs of the presence of God, in these days.

The Gospel readings for this year, and particularly this month before Lent, are from the story of Jesus in Luke. Luke is the gospel for year C of the revised common lectionary, (RCL), the 3<sup>rd</sup> in the 3- year cycle of readings.

Especially at this time of year, we find ourselves early in the stories of Luke, after the time of Christmas. We hear of Jesus visit to his hometown of Nazareth, for his inaugural sermon, where he is rejected by his own people, who want to throw him off a nearby cliff! A foreshadowing of his rejection in Jerusalem, at the climax of Luke's story.

This is followed by the tale of the miraculous catch of fish, (Luke 5) where Peter is converted into becoming a disciple, along with his fishing partners, James & John. So the Jesus movement begins, as does the start of Christian faith, with the first to believe in and follow Jesus as the Messiah, & Savior!

For the next couple of weeks, Jesus teaches the people, and we hear Luke's (shorter) version of the Beatitudes, and early teachings from the "Sermon on the plain." Here we are admonished to "Love those who do not love us back." Including enemies. And the Antioch Bible I've been studying lately, adds this note in Luke's version: "But love your enemies, do good to them, lend to them, AND DO NOT CUT OFF ANY PERSON'S HOPE. Then your reward will be great, and you will be children of the Most High, for he is kind to the wicked and the ungrateful. Therefore, be merciful, as your Father is merciful."

Imagine that! As far as I am aware, no other understanding of God, tells us to "Love our enemies," or teaches us to "Not cut off any person's hope." That is, if we want to be children of the Most High God, the creator of the universe! No other religion, or faith I know of, tells us that our God "is kind to the wicked and the ungrateful."

Thank God this is the case, since we all realize that, at some times at least, its you and me, who are "the wicked and the ungrateful." So, let us, in these days of strange things, including of course, the continuing presence of the disease threat of Covid -19, and the cloudy present and near future of our politics, let us continue to trust, have faith in, and follow the God of Jesus, who guides and leads us by the Holy Spirit, "into all the truth." May you be blessed, so that you can bless others, in these February winter, and Epiphany days!
