#### STEWARDSHIP CORNER

I started writing these articles in April of '22 and quoted Clarence Stoughton, who said, "Stewardship is everything we do after we say 'I believe.'" Since then, we have explored the various aspects of Stewardship and how it relates to our lives. I hope they have been helpful.

We have just completed our "pledge drive" which gave us the opportunity to let leadership of St. John know what we intend to pledge to the church in terms of our time, talents and money, in 2023. Once again, you stepped up and pledged generously to enable this congregation to continue to be a witness in this community and support the wider ministry of the church. Thank you.

On January 6, we begin the season of Epiphany. This year, it is quite long, lasting through February 12. The term epiphany means "to show" or "to make known" or "to reveal." During this season, Christians remember the coming of the wise men bringing gifts to the Christ child, thus "revealing" Jesus to the world as Lord and King. We also look ahead to the church's mission to the world in light of the nativity.

In his article for CRI/Voice, **The Season of Epiphany**, author Dennis Bratcher writes "The Magi who brought gifts to the child Jesus were the first Gentiles to acknowledge Jesus as 'King' and so were the first to 'show' or 'reveal' Jesus to a wider world as the incarnate Christ This act of worship by the Magi which corresponded to Simeon's blessing that this child Jesus would be 'a light for revelation to the Gentiles' (Luke 2:32), was one of the first indications that Jesus came for all people, of all nations, of all races, and that the work of God in the world would not be limited to only a few.

[Epiphany] is now observed as a time of focusing on the mission of the church in reaching others by 'showing' Jesus as the Savior of all people. It is also a time of focusing on Christian community and fellowship, especially in healing the divisions of prejudice and bigotry that we all too often create between God's children."

As the wise men brought gifts to the Christ child, let us continue to offer our gifts of time, talents and money to the Lord, who came that we too might have eternal life with God, as we begin this new year - 2023.

Prayer: Gracious God, we ask that you be with us as we reach out to others by showing Jesus as the Savior of all people. Bless the ministry of the people of St. John in this community and the wider church. Help us to be mindful that all we have and are, are gifts from you for us to use wisely in your service, for the good of others. In Jesus name we pray. Amen.
