A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Here we are at the last month of the year once again! I don't have to tell you about how time simply seems to fly past us more quickly. Time is the same, yet our perspective on time changes as we get older, so it seems to move faster!

If you look in a Bible Concordance (word-finder) at the back of many Bibles, you see there are 880 references to time, taking up 4 pages, along with another 209 references to "times." Which gives over 1000 time words throughout the entire Bible. So our Christian Scripture has something to say about the issue that plagues human existence, called "time."

The only thing I know of that captures time, and stops it, in a way, are photographs and films. A revealing comment was made by actor Robbie Coltrane, who played the gentle giant character Rubeus Hagrid, in the Harry Potter movies, between 2001 & 2012. Hagrid was a 9 & $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. tall half-giant, with a kind character you may not expect from such a big man!

But Coltrane said at the 20th anniversary reunion of Characters in 2022, said: "My children will show the movies to their children, so you could be watching in 50 years time, easy. I'll not be here to see it, sadly, but Hagrid will." He said that the year before he died at age 72.

Yes, the strange issue of time meets us at the end of every year! And the Bible tells us some things about time. Romans 5:6, St. Paul writes: **"For while we were still weak, at the right time, Christ died for the ungodly."**

In a Christmas reading, we hear: "When the fullness of time had come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, in order to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as children." (Galatians 4:4-5)

"When the fullness of time had come." God seems to decide when the time is right, or full.

But we, the followers of Christ, are challenged to learn what time it is, to know the time & how God is working in time. Such as: (Luke 19:44) A near future prediction – They will crush you to the ground, you and your children within you, and they will not leave within you one stone upon another; because you did not recognize the TIME of your visitation from God."

Which tells us, God came to our world in Christ, the first Christmas, and still comes to us, in the presence of the Holy Spirit, to direct us to the doings of God.

In the "Complete Jewish Bible," translation, used by Messianic Jews, who refer to Jesus as "Yeshua," which I like, in the prologue of John 1, the passage uses the word "Shekinah," Glory. The definition is "Divine Presence."

So, to speak of God's glory, at Christmas, this time of year, or really, at any other time, we can know that the Divine presence, especially through the Holy Spirit, is still with us, as the "comforter, helper, and advocate," into the new year, and you can say, as long as time lasts! A comforting thought, at the end of the year for 2023, and the start of the new one, in 2024!





Some charities are not listed on Charity Navigator (many of the Lutheran charities are not) and then you/I have to decide in faith, whether to give to them or not.

THANK YOU to each of you, who responded with a pledge of financial support, and also turned in your Time and Talent worksheet. As I have been pointing out all this past year, stewardship is so much more than the giving of money to church and charities. It is also the giving of your time to the various activities of the church, your neighbor and community, the care of creation, being stewards of God's grace and love etc. Stewardship is involved in all we do and have. I pray that we will all be better stewards in all of its aspects in 2024.

Treasurer's Update As Of October 31, 2023

The St John Lutheran Church Council would like to thank you for your generosity. Without your financial support, the mission and ministry of St John would not be possible. The Council would also like to keep you updated on the financial situation at St John.

The <u>Unified Budget</u> supports the work of the church through education, evangelism, worship, youth programs, stewardship, public relations, utilities & property upkeep, mission support, salaries, office expenses, and insurance. These items are all included in our line-item budget.

Year-To-Date income	\$ 92,690	
Year-To-Date expenses	\$133,150	(including \$12,920 for Mission Support)

The result is that St John currently has a deficit in our Unified Budget of \$40,500. We do have \$25,000 in the contingency fund as shown below to help cover any year-end deficits, but we don't want to deplete that fund. Please prayerfully consider your support of the ongoing mission of St John Church as we reach the end of the year.

<u>Mission Support</u> is an important part of our Unified Budget. St John has distributed \$12,920 to the budgeted mission agencies for 2023 including the ELCA, Lutheran Social Services, five mission partners, and six local community agencies.

The <u>Contingency Fund</u> is outside of the Unified Budget, and is used as needed for unforeseen expenses and to offset any year-end differences between income and expenses in the Unified Budget. Any balance remaining at the end of the year will carryover to next year. Income to this fund comes from direct gifts (such as Thrivent member directed gifts), interest on savings accounts or CDs, building and utility expense sharing from Prime Horizon, and fund raising activities such as the chili dinner. Current amount in the fund \$24.991

The <u>Property Fund</u> supports any extraordinary maintenance of the building and property that is not covered under Unified Budget expenses. Current amount in the fund \$9,683

The <u>Memorial Fund</u> receives gifts for memorials and honoraria. Families of the deceased can make a request to the Council to use the memorials for specific purposes, or the funds can be used for other projects as voted upon by the St John Congregation. Current amount in the fund \$134,890

This year's receipts to the fund include memorials for Walt Thompson, Sue Travis, Harold Immekus, and Marian Carraway.

The most recent distribution from this fund was for the upgrade to the sound system.

This update does not include all funds at St John. A detailed listing of all budget expense line items and funds is posted on the bulletin board in the hallway, or you can contact the treasurer Peter Viesselmann, or any Council member.
