THOUGHTS FROM THE PRESIDENT

February is traditionally known as the "month of love." Valentine's Day is right around the corner, and we see lots of pink and red hearts, chocolates a plenty, and beautiful flowers. Whatever Valentine's Day means to you, I think it's a great opportunity to celebrate love, for your family, friends, and your neighbors. Jesus did say that people would know us by our love.

While writing this article, I came across a book by Gary Chapman called "The Five Love Languages." I've had numerous discussions within my family about love languages, but have never read this book, although I do believe I will be putting it on my "to read" list. The book talks about five love languages: words of affirmation, quality time, acts of service, gifts and physical touch, and how each of us tend to show love, and prefer to receive it, in these five distinctive ways. Often, a failure to understand how others prefer to receive love can cause conflict and feelings of being unloved and misunderstood. Wanting to feel loved and not feeling it can be one of the most challenging places in our lives.

So what do you think God's love language is? How does He prefer to receive love? Chances are pretty good that it isn't one of the five in Gary Chapman's book. As I read more about it, the most constant and consistent theme running through the Bible is obedience. So maybe obedience, then, is God's love language?

How many times have we deliberately disobeyed God's clear instructions? Have you allowed Satan to inject doubt about what God really said, or allowed other people to talk you out of obeying God? Think of Adam in the Garden of Eden. Adam was given a pretty clear command from God that he chose to disregard. The bible couldn't be much clearer about obedience with text in the Book of John. "If you love Me, keep My commandments" John 14:15. "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who love Me" John 14:21. And one more from 1 John "For this is the love of God, that we keep His commandments. And His commandments are not burdensome" 1 John 5:3. The greatest commandment, which we hear regularly from Pastor Jim in his sermons, (and from the Book of Matthew) is to love the Lord our God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength.

It seems that loving God is totally linked to obeying Him. Aside from the obvious importance of following His command, it also seems to be showing what God expects from us and what it "does for" Him, our love for Him. If we take the time to make the people around us feel loved, how much more important should it be for us to take the time to learn our Creator's love language so that he knows we love Him? God so loved us that He gave His only begotten son to be sacrificed that we may live. Doesn't it just make sense to show Him how much we love him back? While we learn the love languages of the people around us, let's be sure to give emphasis to learning God's love language as well.

Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It does not dishonor others, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres. Love never fails. 1 Corinthians 13:4-8




